The next CBA tournament will be held at River City Lanes located at 101 Chelsea Road, Monticello, MN 55362. Our host proprietor is Mark Parnell. This 24-lane AMF center features automatic scoring along with a full bar (Foul Line Sports Bar) and complete restaurant (Vintage Grill). Traveling on Hwy 94 take Hwy 25(Monticello exit) south to Chelsea Road, turn left and lanes are approx 1/2 mile on left.

The format for this tournament will consist of 8 match play games from the start with a 10 pin bonus per match. We will cut to the top 8 and they will bowl standard match for 7 games with the 30 bonus pins and all carry over and then the position round will decide the champion. This format will not include a stepladder.

Brackets for this tournament will be for games 2-3-4, 3-4-5 and 5-6-7. Mini Eliminator will be games 2-3-4 and 5-6-7.

### ***Local Bowlers Leading Average at ABC Congratulations to Lantto, Savoy & Fietek***

Sam Lantto of Eden Prairie, Minn., can claim that he's on top of the bowling world in more ways than one.

Lantto, 40, has moved to the top spot on the prestigious American Bowling Congress Championships Tournament lifetime average list with a 214.49 average over 21 years, topping his Tournament teammate, Todd Savoy of Superior, Wis., by a quarter of a pin.

The lifetime average list consists of active bowlers who have competed in the ABC Tournament for 20 or more years.

### **ABC MASTERS**

***The ABC Masters this year will be October 24<sup>th</sup> through the 31<sup>st</sup>. The Minneapolis Masters will be the only tournament this year with the champion getting the entry. The St Paul Masters is after the ABC Masters is over so Matt Lang came up with an idea. At the September Linds Invitational tournament we will offer a \$15 per bowler chance to win the \$450 entry. The top bowler in that tournament will get the paid entry provided we get at least 20 bowlers to enter. Matt Lang and Tom Corbett will make up the difference.***

## Scott Pohl Wins Again for 9<sup>th</sup> CBA Title

For the 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive CBA tournament **Scott Pohl** found himself bowling for the title. At the May tournament Pohl faced **John Kreyer Jr** and won, at the June tournament Pohl again faced Kreyer Jr but took 2<sup>nd</sup>. At the July tournament at AMF Southtown Lanes it again was looking like Pohl would face Kreyer Jr, but a veteran bowler named **Terry Schacht** took care of Kreyer Jr in the semifinal match 225-199. Schacht, who has 6 CBA titles and is a member of the Hall of Fame, was showing everyone why he has been one of the best around. Schacht took care of Kreyer 225-199 to bowl fellow Hall of Fame member Pohl for the title. After an open frame in the 6<sup>th</sup> by Schacht, Pohl showed why he is one of the best by stringing together a 6-bagger to put away the match 238-188 for his 9<sup>th</sup> CBA title.

The first stepladder match had 3 bowlers competing to see who would advance. **John Kreyer Jr, Carl Fietek and Bob Wolfe** qualified 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> respectively after 12 games. Kreyer Jr took care of the other 2 bowlers with a 267 with Fietek shooting 218 and Wolfe 193. Kreyer then bowled against another veteran in **Randy Bartz** and took care of him 259-225.

This was a new format for the CBA as the 1<sup>st</sup> round of qualifying was 6 games and the top 24 advanced to bowl 3 more games. After 9 games we cut to the top 12 and then 3 more games and cut to the top 6 who bowled the stepladder. The first cut took a score of 1278 (213 avg) and the 9 game cut was 2048 (227 avg). To get to the top 6 the cut score was 2780 (231 avg).

The Qualifying Leader was determined after 9 games and **Carl Fietek** was leading with 2185 (242 avg). Joe Cairl won the rolloff for the "On Track Casher" and a free entry into the CBA in August at River City Lanes.

Honor scores were an 805 shot by **Bob Wolfe** in games 7-8-9 and 300's by **David Oulman** and **Carl Fietek** and a 299 by **Richard Vitko**.
